1. Who is a 'person'?

If you answered 'yes' to any of the above questions, you and/or your organisation are a *'person'* within the meaning of *<u>'person</u>* conducting a business or undertaking'.

Note: Individuals who are in a partnership attract the responsibilities of a 'person conducting a business or undertaking', both individually and collectively.

2. What is the structure of 'a business or undertaking'?

Do you, or does your organisation:			
engage in activities with a view to making a financial profit, and adhere to a system, or have some kind of organisational structure, with a degree of continuity?	□ YES	□ NO	
engage in activities for a non-commercial purpose, but have elements of organisation, systems and possibly continuity?	□ YES	□ NO	
If you answered 'yes' to the first question, it is likely that you and/or your organisation are conducting a 'business'. If you answered 'yes' to the			





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second question, it is likely that you and/or your organisation are conducting an *'undertaking'*.

3. What kind of 'work' is involved in a business or undertaking?

If you answered 'yes' to one or more of the above questions, it is likely that you and/or your organisation are a ' <i>person conducting a business or</i>				

undertaking'.

4. Who is excluded from being a 'person conducting a business or undertaking'?

(a) Volunteer associations—Does your organisation:				
>	act on a voluntary basis, without payment or reward?		□ NO	
>	work as a group without employees toward a community purpose, such as philanthropic or benevolent purposes, including promotion of art, culture, science, religion, education, medicine or a charity?	□ YES	□ NO

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If you answered 'yes' to any of the above questions, it is likely that your organisation is a volunteer association, and excluded from being a 'person conducting a business or undertaking'.

Note: If the volunteer association employs paid workers, then the association is **not** excluded from being a 'person conducting a business or undertaking'.
